#### A Time to Grow

Esther's early education was in the public schools of Caroline County, Virginia. She later moved to Washington, D.C. where she continued her education and graduated from the University of the District of Columbia (UDC). She was employed with Jelleff's Department Store as a Stock Clerk of Silver Spring, Maryland, Fannie Mae as a Cashier of Washington, DC, National Institutes of Health (NIH) as a Seamstress and Elevator Operator of Bethesda, Maryland, and the United Planning Organization (UPO) Foster Grandparent of Washington, DC (sites included Children's Hospital and First Rock Baptist Daycare Center) just to name a few. She received several Outstanding Awards from the Children's Medical Center and Certificate of Recognition from United Planning Organization. She wrote a book but never had it published entitled "Faith, Prayer, and Healing" and published a poem entitled "When I Think of Yahshua".
